FIRE PREVENTION IN SHORT-TERM RENTALS

Renters: for a safe stay

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When booking	
	Make sure that the owner's rental sheet shows a registration number issued by the Corporation de l'industrie touristique du Québec.
	Check whether the owner displays detection devices (e.g. smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, fire alarms, etc.) on the reservation platform.
On arrival at the short-term rental	
Smoke detectors	
	Check for smoke alarms. There must be one on each floor, including in the basement.
	Test smoke alarms using the button provided (do not use smoke from a match).
	Never disable smoke alarms.
Carbon monoxide alarms	
	Check for the presence of carbon monoxide alarms. There must be at least one if there's an attached garage or non-electric heating or cooking appliances (e.g. gas stove).
	Make sure the carbon monoxide alarm(s) are in working order.
Safety instructions	
	Please read the safety instructions for the equipment supplied with your rental. (e.g. BBQ operation).
	Read the safety instructions posted on site.
Means of evacuation	
	Identify two possible outcomes.
	Make sure that the drainage system is free of obstructions and accessible.
	Check the fire assembly point identified by the owner or identify one (e.g. parking lot).
Cooking fires	
	Keep a constant eye on food as it cooks, and use a timer.
