

By-law 2014-007

Regulations regarding the municipality's transfer station and the disposal of commercial and household garbage and recyclables.

Resolution 2014-09-196

Whereas it is necessary to regulate the management of the municipal transfer station as well as the collection and disposal of commercial and household garbage and recyclables.

Whereas notice of motion was given by Denis Dubeau at the regular council meeting of August 11, 2014

For these reasons,

It is motioned by and unanimously resolved that the present by-law number 2014-007 entitled "Regulations regarding the municipality's transfer site and the collection and disposal of commercial and household garbage and recyclables" is decreed as follows:

By-Law number 2014-007

By-law number 2014-007 - Regulations regarding the municipality's transfer site and the collection and disposal of commercial and household garbage and recyclables.

Article 1

The preamble is part of the present by-law

Article 2

The municipality of Litchfield operates a small transfer station situated on McCoshen Road in the municipality of Litchfield. The transfer station is in conformity with " *Le Règlement sur l'enfouissement et l'incinération de matières résiduelles* (REIMR).

Article 3

The site is accessible to the taxpayers and residents of the municipality of Litchfield only.

Article 4

The transfer station will be open on Thursdays and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. unless otherwise specified by council.

Article 5

The municipal transfer site will accept the following materials:

- **Appliances and other types of metal**
- **Rimless tires**
- **Branches, hedges trimming, leaves, grass**
- **Regular domestic waste**
- **Recyclables**

Article 6

The following items are not accepted at the municipal transfer station

- Carcasses of any kind
- All construction material including shingles, insulation, cement blocks, bricks, windows, wooden doors etc.
- Heavy equipment tires.
- Heavy industrial plastic wrap

Article 7

The transfer station will be supervised and a proof of residency will be required.

Article 8

All commercial buildings and businesses including restaurants, grocery stores, corner stores, office buildings, pharmacies etc must assure that they dispose of their residual material in compliance with the *Règlement sur l'enfouissement et l'incinération de matières résiduelles* (REIMR), by using the contractor of your choice.

Article 9

A container will be provided at the small municipal transfer station for the collection of dangerous products such as paint, oil and aerosol cans.

Article 10

The attached annexes A and B are part of the present by-law

Article 11

The present by-law abrogates all other by-laws regarding the disposal of commercial and household garbage and recyclables.

Article 12

The present by-law comes into effect according to the law.
